## Important messages from the office

#### **Use of School & Community Grounds**

It has come to our attention that our school turf field is being disrespected by dog owners in our community. Dog feces on the field has been a primary issue for our Soccer Academy Coaching staff and students that regularly use this field. Whilst we all love animals, please remember, unleashed pets are prohibited on school grounds. Please pick up after your dog if you choose to walk them on school grounds.

We have also had a number of complaints from nearby neighbors about the amount of garbage that is being left behind in the surrounding parks & along the sidewalks when students are loitering in the area. We have been told that neighbors will be calling the City of Maple Ridge bylaws and reporting the littering issue, which could result in fines to the student(s). We are asking you to please ask your child to make sure they are finding an appropriate home for their garbage, such as a garbage can at the school. We appreciate your help in this matter.

#### I-Days, Semester Turn around & Report Cards

As we approach the end of Semester 1, if your child is at risk of not successfully completing a course they may be invited to attend I-days on January 31 and February 1 to be given the opportunity to complete assignments to work towards successful completion of the course. ## Sexual Exploitation Education will be presenting: CYBERSAFE!

On February 28 all students at WSS will attend grade level assemblies to learn about how to protect themselves online from sexual exploitation. The presentation is put on by <u>Sexual</u> <u>Exploitation Education</u>, a Canadian agency that provides education focussed on preventing sexual exploitation and human trafficking to schools across Canada. #### Who is SEE?

Sexual Exploitation Education (SEE) is a prevention focused agency that provides innovative, engaging, and accessible presentations, training, and consulting services to schools, organizations, and businesses across Canada. Their mission is to prevent sexual exploitation and human trafficking by focusing on root causes that contribute to sexual exploitation. Using humor and multimedia, we make this issue relatable to all. Their approach has been featured in media outlets such as CBC news, Global News, and local Newspapers.

Their team of experts are passionate about sharing their knowledge and raising awareness about this important issue. They believe that everyone has a role in preventing sexual exploitation, and we are committed to working with individuals, organizations, and communities to create safer environments for all.

Since its inception, SEE has been a leading agency in this field, being called upon for research, pro-d keynotes, international conference presentations, nation-wide law enforcement training, and non profit consulting. SEE is also proud to introduce the very first prevention education app, the SEE-App!

#### What is Cybersafe about?

At any given time, there are over 700,000 predators online looking to connect with minors

- The average age of a victim targeted is 14-17 years old
- Sextortion rates have tripled every year since the pandemic
- 42% of teens who sexted had it shared without consent
- More teens are being groomed into using certain platforms and apps for self exploitation

This presentation addresses all of the above issues and more, by discussing consent, healthy boundaries, and internet dynamics. With these skillsets, youth can truly be immune to all forms of online exploitation!

This presentation builds resiliency to online sexual exploitation while engaging students through humour, games, and activities.

## **Pink Shirt Day**

The Ministry of Education and Child Care asked the ARC Foundation (specifically Justene Dion-Glowa) to request design applications from students across the province for this year's Pink Shirt Day design. Justene reached out to all the SOGI-club sponsor teachers on the district's mailing list (including Kaitlyn Poirier, Krystyna Doran-Eddy, and Hilaire Ford) to share the design requirements with students.

The design had to be a 1-color design with an anti-homophobia message, in the highest resolution possible in a .jpeg or .tiff file format. We got all this information on November 30th, and had to submit a design by December 16th, and we barely made the deadline because of the winter holidays! Elliot Volpe from Westview submitted the winning design!
